Mr. Adam disobeyed God by eating the fruit offered by his wife, Eve. Unfortunately, Eve was influenced by the devil, who was acting as a serpent. Eve offered the fruit to Adam, and Eve also misinterpreted what God had said. God had told them not to eat the fruit, not to even touch it. However, the Serpent told her that God was wrong—that they would become like God when they ate the fruit, knowing good and evil, and they would not die! Satan fell from heaven to earth like lightning for the same reason: wanting to be like God. Adam and Eve fell for the lie! They ate the fruit they were forbidden to eat, and as a result of this disobedience, God's fury fell on them.

God first blamed the Serpent. God told the Serpent that he would walk on his belly, and the dust of the earth he would eat all of his life. To the woman, God said that her childbirth would be so painful, and that her offspring would bite the head of Satan, and Satan would bite his heel. Adam was told to get out of the garden and work till he died. So, God cursed all three involved in the disobedience, and as a result, the sin gene entered into Adam and Eve's sperm and ovum. The man's sperm XY gene became the sin gene, and the woman's XX gene in the ovum became the sin gene. And if you sin, there is a Scripture called 1 John 1:9 that says, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." So, the Lord has kept the door open in case our human nature and flesh sin, even if we don't want to. That is a scripture that I call "Christian soap"! When we die, our human body goes to the grave; but our spirit and soul, which are born again, go to heaven, waiting for the rapture. If we are still alive waiting for the second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ, then we will have a glorified body, just like the Lord Jesus—thirty-three years old, young, never to die, no pain, and no sorrows, always happy in the everlasting presence of God. The ultimate presence with God is in the city of New

Jerusalem, according to Revelations 21 and 22, where we will be with God forever and ever and ever. What a blessing to be a Christian! When we accept the Lord Jesus as our Lord and Savior, we also become adopted sons of God. When we are baptized in the Holy Spirit, we have our inheritance in heaven assured, and we also become sons of God equal to the Lord Jesus. So, in heaven we have an equal inheritance as our Lord Jesus, according to the Bible.

We who are alive now are looking forward to the return of our Lord Jesus Christ, who will come in the clouds to receive us according to 1 Thessalonians 4:16 and 17 (the rapture).

The Lord Jesus will not touch the earth at this time. I welcome you to say this prayer. So, dear brother and sister, repeat this prayer:

"Dear Lord Jesus, I am a sinner; I repent of my sins. I know you died, were buried, and after three days ascended to heaven, and you are alive today according to Romans 10:9-10. I accept you as my Lord and Savior with my mouth and believe in my heart that You were raised from the dead to bring me life!"

It is with your heart you believe and are justified, and with your mouth you are saved! Romans 10:13 says that everyone that calls on the name of the Lord will be saved! So, my dear brothers and sisters, you are born again! The next step is to get a Bible, join a Bible-believing church, pray, pray, pray, and enjoy the Christian life. We are assured of eternal life with the Trinity (God, the Father; the Son, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ; and our special friend, the Holy Spirit).

After accepting Jesus as Lord and Savior, a believer should pray and find a Bible-believing church. Pray, pray, pray, and read the Bible every day! However, you also need to have two baptisms. Now, this is not necessary to be saved you've already accepted Jesus as Lord and Savior and are saved. But these two things are done after salvation. One is water baptism, where you are immersed in the water by a holy priest. This type of baptism demonstrates the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. Chapter 5, the muscle system, and chapter 6, the digestive system, and how we are made in the exact likeness of God in physical form. Chapter 7 will cover allergy and immunology. The most common causes of death will be covered in chapter 8. Chapter 9 covers the Bible verses that have helped tremendously in this author's life, and finally in chapter 10, our God's website, www.victoriouschristianlife.org.

The Bible: The Eternal Word of God

In my humble opinion, the Bible is at the top of the spiritual and the natural world, and nobody can counterfeit it—because God says in His Word that His Word is eternal. He says heaven and earth will pass away, but His Word will never pass away. So, every word of the Bible is God's Word. Wow! What a blessing!



WORLD SYSTEM

Nature refers to the human body controlled by the world system of education, medicine, human knowledge, and all worldly things. But the spiritual part goes with the gift of the Holy Spirit. The fruit will be love, joy, peace, longsuffering, goodness, kindness, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control. There are also nine other gifts of the Holy Spirit-remember, these are gifts. The gifts are word of knowledge, word of wisdom, gift of prophecy, gift of faith, gift of healing, working of miracles, discerning of spirits, and gift of tongues and interpretation.

PEOPLE

All those who don't believe in our God at all—in the science field, educators, researchers, politicians, some of my fellow physicians, and other non-Christian religions, etc.

What the Bible is All About

We start with the gospel of John. John 3:1-22 (KJV) states that there is a very interesting discussion between a Pharisee leader, Nicodemus, and our Master, Jesus. Let me quote it to you from the scripture: "There was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. The same came to Jesus by night," (in my opinion, he came by night because he didn't want to be seen with Jesus) "and said unto him, Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him. Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be BORN AGAIN, he cannot see the kingdom of God. Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born? Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say

unto thee, except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again. The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit." The next verse says, "Nicodemus answered and said unto Him, How can these things be? Jesus answered and said unto him, Art thou a master of Israel, and knowest not these things? Verily, verily, I say unto thee, We speak that we do know, and testify that we have seen; and ye receive not our witness. If I have told you earthly things, and ye believe not, how shall ye believe, if I tell you of heavenly things? And no man hath ascended up to heaven, but he that came down from heaven, even the Son of man which is in heaven." The next verse says, "And as Moses lifted up the ser-

pent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man must be lifted up." (And in my opinion the serpent represented the devil, and as he was lifted up on earth, the Son of Man, the Lord Jesus, will be lifted up on the cross—this is my interpretation). "That whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (In my opinion, this is a mini-Bible! It can be summed up in one verse, and this is IT! What a blessing we have!) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through Him might be saved. He that believeth on Him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were

evil. For every one that doeth evil hateth the light, neither cometh to the light, lest his deeds should be reproved." (In other words, exposed.) "But he that doeth truth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made manifest, that they are wrought in God. After these things came Jesus and his disciples into the land of Judea; and there He tarried with them and baptized."

Let us go to the next chapter, where Jesus encounters a Samaritan woman. This is John chapter 4, and we start with verse 5, going through verse 41: "Then cometh He to a city of Samaria, which is called Sychar, near to the parcel of ground that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, being wearied with His journey, sat thus on the well: and it was about the sixth hour." (That's almost 12:00 p.m. our time.) "There cometh a woman of Samaria to draw water: Jesus saith unto her, Give me to drink. (For His disciples were gone away unto the city to buy meat.)" (Now it is my

personal feeling that John was still there, but he doesn't want to mention his own name—but this is my opinion.)

"Then saith the woman of Samaria unto Him, How is it that thou, being a Jew, askest drink of me, which am a woman of Samaria? For the Jews have no dealings with the Samaritans. Jesus answered and said unto her, If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of Him, and He would have given thee living water. The woman saith unto Him, Sir, thou hast nothing to draw with, and the well is deep: from whence then hast thou that living water? Art thou greater than our father Jacob, which gave us the well, and drank thereof himself, and his children, and his cattle?

Jesus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again: but whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life. The woman saith unto Him, Sir, give me this water, that I thirst not, neither come hither to draw. Jesus saith unto her, Go, call thy husband, and come hither. The woman answered and said, I have no husband. Jesus said unto her, Thou hast well said, I have no husband: for thou hast had five husbands; and he whom thou now hast is not thy husband...

The woman saith unto Him, Sir, I perceive that thou art a prophet. Our fathers worshipped in this mountain; and ye say, that in Jerusalem is the place where men ought to worship. Jesus saith unto her, Woman, believe me, the hour cometh, when ye shall neither in this mountain, nor yet at Jerusalem, worship the Father. Ye worship ye know not what: we know what we worship: for salvation is of the Jews. But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and

in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship Him. God is a Spirit: and they that worship Him must worship Him in spirit and in truth. The woman saith unto him, I know that Messiah cometh, which is called Christ: when He is come, He will tell us all things. Jesus saith unto her, I that speak unto thee am He." (Wow! This is the first confession, to a Samaritan woman of the Lord.)

"And upon this came His disciples, and marveled that He talked with the woman: yet no man said, What seekest thou? or, Why talkest thou with her? The woman then left her water pot, and went her way into the city, and saith to the men, Come, see a man, which told me all things that ever I did: is not this the Christ?" (This is evidence of the first female evangelist! Even when Jesus was on earth!)

"Then they went out of the city and came unto Him. In the mean while His disciples prayed Him, saying, Master, eat. But He said

unto them, I have meat to eat that ye know not of. Therefore said the disciples one to another, Hath any man brought Him ought to eat? Jesus saith unto them, My meat is to do the will of Him that sent me, and to finish His work. Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? Behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest." (He was talking about salvation! Life eternal!) Verse 37: "And herein is that saving true, One soweth, and another reapeth. I sent you to reap that whereon ye bestowed no labour: other men laboured, and ye are entered into their labours. And many of the Samaritans of that city believed on Him for the saying of the woman, which testified. He told me all that ever I did. So when the Samaritans were come unto Him, they besought Him that He would tarry with them: and He abode there two days. And many more believed because of His own word."

Here is an example of the Lord Jesus, with one Samaritan woman, winning many to the kingdom because they believed in Him!

CHAPTER 1

Embryology

The total picture of the human body is described in the standard books of anatomy, physiology, pathology, and allergy and immunology; they refer to the fine details of the human body. However, I am going to describe to you briefly what I consider the most important phenomena in the formation, maintenance, and substance of the human body, and the most common causes of death. This is my narrative of the entire human body, so please keep that in mind.

This is just a synopsis of the entire human system. We start with embryology; that is how the embryos are formed and how they unite to form a cell called a zygote. And now, the human being is formed.

Let's look at the female side first. The human female has two ovaries, given by God. They are on either side of the fallopian tubes. Each ovary has a cortex and a medulla. The cortex of each ovary contains primordial follicles. They gradually mature as the woman ages plus after puberty. These primordial follicles form the so-called primary oocyte, and they still contain forty-six chromosomes; however, when the primary oocyte develops into a secondary oocyte, the chromosomes are reduced from forty-six to twenty-three. That is a division called meiosis. This becomes an ovum to be fertilized. So then the sperm unites with the secondary oocyte or the ovum, and the final product is called a zygote, which contains forty-six chromosomes-twenty-three from the female side, and twenty-three from the male side.

The zygote migrates into the tube and is implanted into the inner lining of the uterus. It then divides into two cells, then four, then eight, and then into sixteen. Ultimately, in the beginning, it forms a round structure called a blastocyst. It's so beautiful to look at! It is like a straight line in the center of the cell, and the upper side and lower side are liquid. From this horizontal line of cells, a human being is gradually produced. The original zygote contains so many genes and chromosomes, for each part of the human body. It's amazing how God has made us; each cell migrates to the part where it is supposed to migrate! For example, the cell that is supposed to form the brain migrates to the brain, and the cell that is supposed to form the lung migrates to the lung, and so forth. The female sex organs are formed by the same cells that are designated to form them. It's amazing


how God has controlled each cell from the beginning. And finally, as you see in the pictures below, a fetus is formed and increases in size! The fetus is surrounded by amniotic fluid, and the entire human being (or the fetus) is also connected to the mother's womb by a small organ called the placenta, which is connected by the umbilical cord to the fetus. The blood exchange takes place all the time, and the fetus becomes viable because of the blood of the mother, in a sense. After nine months of the human conception, a small baby is formed. The woman goes into labor, and the baby comes through the birth canal and takes his first breath into this world system, and they usually cry. When they cry, oxygen goes into their lungs, and they become a living soul.

Just for the purpose of description, let me describe to you how a male sperm is formed. It has a head, neck, and tail, and is formed in the human organ called the testes. There are two testes in the human body, in the scrotum. Each testicle contains an outer and inner layer of sperm-forming cells. And the sperm is formed and is collected in the center of the testicle, and ultimately they are transmitted to the epididymis and through the prostate and the male urethra. During the time of sexual union, the sperm is ejected into the vagina of the female genital tract. From there, they transmit through the tube towards the ovary, and the lucky guy wins and unites with the ovum. The human being, called a zygote, starts to form. God has created such a wonderful system that is still working! We have 7.5 billion human beings on this planet right now. They come and go. CHAPTER 2

Central Nervous System

The central nervous system is depicted in image 6. This system is composed of the brain and the skull, including the cerebellum, and extends into the spinal cord vertebrae (spine). Out of this system, many, many nerves go out to cover each part of the body. Cranial nerves are going out from the brain and the spinal cord, going to different parts of the body. They are named ac-

cording to the location where they go. Please see the figure below.

Brain – (the most complex organ in the body) sends signals to the body

Cerebellum – coordinates voluntary movements Spinal cord – sends messages to the body from

the brain, and from the body to the brain Brachial plexus – controls the muscles of the

shoulder, elbow, wrist, and hand

- Musculocutaneous nerve sends signals to the muscles
- Radial, subcostal, and median nerves all go to the upper arm

Common peroneal, deep peroneal, superficial peroneal nerves – all go to lower limbs Intercostal nerve – goes to chest and abdomen

There are also twelve cranial nerves, which cover different parts of the body—for example, the optic nerve goes to the eyes. In image 7 you will see a cross-section of the brain. The central sulcus divides the brain in the middle.

Frontal lobe – gives us the ability to reason, organize, plan, speak, and move

Parietal lobe – gives us sensory information—

touch, temperature, pressure, and pain

- Temporal lobe gives us sensory information for hearing, language, and memories
- Occipital lobe gives us visual processing, depth, distance, etc.

Image 8 depicts the brain neurons.

- Bipolar neuron specialized neurons for special senses
- Motor neuron carries instructions to the muscles


Glial cell – provides support for neurons

Image 9 shows the spinal cord, which connects the brain to the body.






CHAPTER 3

Cardiovascular System

This image (10) shows the cardiovascular and pulmonary systems in the thoracic cavity.

Image 11 shows the blood vessels coming and going from the heart and lungs. Let us go to the next image (12) of the heart. This image shows how beautifully the heart is made. The heart has a right and a left side, divided by muscular walls called the septum. It shows the superior vena cava, which draws the venous blood from the body, opening into the right atrium, from which the blood passes through the right ventricle into the pulmonary artery and into the lungs. This blood is cleared of carbon dioxide and imparted with oxygen in the blood. From the lungs, oxygenated blood returns to the left atrium, where it passes thru the mitral valve into the left ventricle; from there, it enters the aorta and is distributed to the whole body. Oxygen goes to each cell.


The aorta is divided into large arteries, which divide into smaller arteries; they become smaller and smaller, until they become tiny capillaries. This supplies oxygen to the cells and takes out carbon dioxide and other garbage from the blood to the heart and lungs.

Right atrium – gets blood from veins and sends to right ventricle Right ventricle – pumps blood to the lungs to be oxygenated

Left atrium – gets oxygenated blood from the lungs and sends to the left ventricle Left ventricle – sends oxygen-rich blood to the body

The heart pumps seventy-two average beats a minute, twenty-four/seven. It is said that in a lifetime, our hearts beat billions of times!




CHAPTER 4

Urinary System

All cells of the body produce a variety of wastes that need to be removed from the body. If they accumulate in the body fluids, they cause toxic symptoms. The body fluids, such as lymph and blood, are used to carry the waste to the kidney system. The urinary system is used to clear the body of unnecessary nitrogen and salts. This helps maintain the normal body pH and fluid and electrolyte balance. Now the image shows a pair of kidneys. When various substances from the blood are removed, urine is formed, which contains waste products. The urine travels through the ureter and is stored in a sac-like structure called the urinary bladder, from which it is excreted outside the body by a urethra. This, in short, completes the urinary system.

Image 13 shows both kidneys. The venous blood is shown in blue, the arteries are shown in red, and the ureters are shown in yellow.

Image 14 shows a kidney in the transection, showing the cortex and the medulla at corresponding levels. These parts of the kidneys clear the body of toxic wastes and remove them by forming urine, which is transmitted from the hylum of the kidney through the ureters.





CHAPTER 5

Muscle System

There are three kinds of muscles in the body.

Skeletal muscles – line the bones and are responsible for body motion
Smooth muscles – line the inside of the body, alimentary canal and bladder, etc.
Cardiac muscles – compose the tissues of the heart, and are responsible for heart functions

Images 15, 16, and 17 depict the skeletal muscles.

How beautiful they are! The pictures show the skeletal system from the back, skull, and vertebra. Now, in the front in the region of the head, the names of the skeletal muscles are the frontalis, orbicularis oculi, and the zygomaticus. Next is the masseter, orbicularis oris, epicranial aponeurosis, occipitofrontalis, and the temporal.

Next are the muscles of the neck. In the front region is the trapezius, sternocleidomastoid, splenius capitis, and the platysma, which extends into the neck. The muscles of the chest and forearm start with the deltoid, pectoralis major, serratus anterior, biceps brachii, and brachialis.

The front abdominal muscles are the external obliques and rectus abdominis. The thigh muscles are the tensor fasciae latae, sartorius, rectus femoris, adductor longus, gracilis, vastus

medialis, and vastus lateralis. The front muscles of the leg are the fibularis longus, tibialis anterior, gastrocnemius, soleus, and the extensor muscles.

Now all these are the muscles in the front of the skeletal system, and now we will go over the back. We start again with the head and neck. First is the temporalis, occipitalis, then the sternocleidomastoid, trapezius, and the minor deltoid, which extends to the back. Then we move to the muscles of the back: the teres major, teres minor, the supraspinatus and infraspinatus, the rhomboids, the latissimus dorsi, and the external oblique.

The muscles of the buttocks are the gluteus maximus, adductor magnus, and the gracilis. Moving to the back of the thigh we have the biceps femoris, semitendinosus, semimembranosus, and vastus lateralis. Continuing down the back of the leg we have the soleus, fibularis longus, gastrocnemius, and the calcaneal tendon. The muscles of the anterior arm are the biceps brachii, and brachialis. In the anterior forearm we have the brachioradialis, pronator teres, extensor carpi, flexor carpi, flexor carpi radialis, palmaris longus, flexor carpi ulnaris, and the pronator quadratus.

Muscles of the posterior forearm are the triceps brachii, brachioradialis, extensor carpi ulnaris, flexor carpi ulnaris, extensor carpi radialis, extensor carpi ulnaris and the extensor digitorum.

Muscles of the hands, feet, and pelvic regions are not included in this list. For that, I refer you to a standard anatomy textbook.





CHAPTER 6

Digestive System


The human digestive system is depicted in images 18 and 19. It starts with the mouth, the pharynx, stomach, liver, pancreas, small and large intestine, rectum, and anus.

The digestive system works this way. The mouth ingests the food, teeth grind the food, and the salivary glands excrete saliva. Food goes to the stomach via the esophagus, and the stomach also secretes hydrochloric acid and breaks down the food. The food passes to the duodenum and

the jejunum and is mixed with enzymes from the liver and pancreas. Food is absorbed into the bloodstream, and it is also absorbed into the large intestines, where a larger absorption takes place. Ultimately, the undigested food is secreted outside the body through the rectum and anus.

This is a brief description of the digestive system. The liver and pancreas produce digestive enzymes. The pancreas also produces insulin, which helps with the regulation of glucose.



CHAPTER 7

Allergy and Immunology

The body's abnormal response to certain foreign substances causes allergies. If the symptom is a stuffy nose, the cause is usually pollen, mold, animal dander, or house dust. Foods or chemicals can also be the cause. House dust and mold usually cause year-round symptoms. Springtime allergies are usually caused by pollens (grasses and trees), or in late summer, ragweed.

Hay fever, asthma, eczema, and urticaria are the most common allergic problems. Symptoms of hay fever—which doesn't involve hay or fever—include sneezing, stuffy or runny nose, and itchy or watery eyes. Spring, summer, or fall, when trees, grasses, and weeds produce pollen, are usually when hay fever occurs. The ragweed produces pollen from late summer until frost, which causes this plant to be one of the biggest culprits for allergies in the eastern United States. A condition that affects the lungs and breathing is asthma, which causes wheezing, cough, or shortness of breath. Eczema and urticaria affect the skin. These cause inflammation of the skin, causing scales, crusts, and patches, usually accompanied by itching. Contact with allergens, certain foods, and some drugs can cause these conditions.

Your body releases histamine if you have allergies to any of these substances, which causes excess watery mucus production and chest congestion, much like a common cold. To try to counteract symptoms of asthma, bronchodilators can be used. Decongestants shrink the swollen nasal tissues, and antihistamines block the effect of histamine for the nose, but these don't always take care of the underlying disease. Sleepiness can be a side effect of some antihistamines, and decongestants can stimulate, so by using a combination of the two, allergy symptoms can be lessened.

Treatment for allergies can be done by allergy shots or sublingual immunotherapy. Skin or blood testing can be used to show what allergies need to be treated, and vials of allergens that you are allergic to can be made for treatment. Blocking antibodies in your bloodstream are caused by taking allergy injections or sublingual drops, which help prevent reactions to allergens. Your allergist will start you at a safe dosage level, and within a few months you should feel significant relief. Therapy is continued for around three years. There is significant improvement or complete relief in around 85% of patients who have regular shots or sublingual drops.

One in four people worldwide develop allergies today, with an estimated forty-five million Americans suffering with allergies. Allergies are inherited, and there is a genetic trait that leaves you more susceptible to develop allergies. If your family has allergies, you are more likely to develop them. Childhood is the most common time for allergies, but they can be developed at any age. An allergist specializes in allergies and can follow the patient's progress and treatment by examination.

Image 20 shows the nasal and paranasal sinuses lined by mucous membranes. These membranes become swollen by allergy attacks, producing mucous and water and other allergy symptoms. Dr. NALIN SHAH

Nose and Paranasal Sinuses


